The Chess'n Math Association is a non-profit organization that brings chess to Canadian youngsters. We offer lessons in schools, tournaments and chess camps. We are currently providing lessons for more than 10,000 children in more than 300 schools across Canada. Chess is not only a great game; it has been proven to be a valuable tool in education as well. Chess helps to stimulate concentration, memorization, imagination, problem solving and logical thinking.

Our chess teaching program has 8 levels, from beginners to advanced players. Part of every lesson is actual chess play with the instructor supervising the games and offering tips and advice. Exercise sheets are provided each week, and at the end of each course a certificate of achievement is awarded to each student.

St. James will be offering chess lessons to students during the **lunch break** on Wednesdays for 8 weeks, starting on **Wednesday**, **January 15th** and ending **Wednesday**, **March 4th.** The cost per child is \$85.
